What is Linqa?

Linqa is a multilingual collaboration platform designed to facilitate communication and teamwork inside diverse organizations. The Linqa UI supports 2 languages at the same time.

Per Linqa installation the 2 languages can be chosen out of 9. The 9 supported languages are English, Spanish, German, French, Portuguese, Swedish, Finnish, Polish and Ukrainian. This tool was developed with public funding and has been used as a vital tool for the Franco-German Forum for the Future. It has clearly enhanced cooperation among stakeholders across various languages.


- Automatic Simultaneous Translation: Engage in real-time discussions while viewing original and translated messages side by side, facilitating understanding like never before.

Linqa is open source software.

All users benefit from the further development of the software. More collaborations mean more features, which means more application possibilities for everyone. The costs for customization and further development of the software are based on your individual needs: price by agreement.

The Linqa platform helps overcoming language barriers by offering collaborative workspaces with automatically translated content.

A workspace comprises of both, a whiteboard on which texts, documents, videos, notes, and photos can be placed, and a chat/discussion panel. The contents of both, the whiteboard, and all chat/discussion messages are translated automatically. So everything happening on the platform is available instantly in two languages.

Chat/Discussion Panel

Besides the whiteboard every workspace has the chat/discussion panel. You can adjust the size of the discussion in relation to the whiteboard. Close the discussion panel to give full room to the whiteboard.

Messages and their translations are displayed at the same time. The user's original message is displayed in the left column, the translation in the right column. It is indicated whether the translation was created automatically or edited manually.
